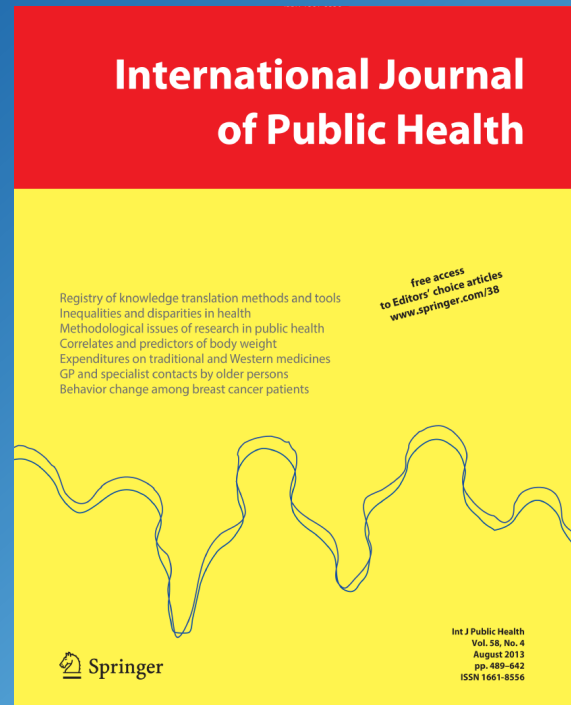

Market-driven forces and public health

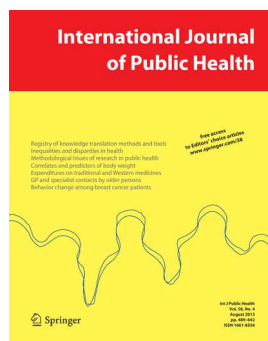
Submit your proposal by

The call relates to the 4th Latin American Public Health Meeting taking place 5 -7th August 2020 in Cali, Colombia. Successful articles will be published "online first" no later than the opening of the conference.

Call for Papers Market-driven forces and public health

Fundamental questions about the relationship between the free market economy and public health remain unsolved, and are especially pressing in the “Global South”. The Global South is not a geographical designation, but includes all historically disadvantaged or excluded regions. To generate proposals for social transformation, there is a need to recognize the Global South and learn from their experience.

IJPH seeks articles that focus on the intersections of market-driven forces and public health. We particularly seek studies that assess relationships of public health issues and the free market economy in “the Global South”. We would find papers on these topics of interest:

- Connections between industry, market, and health policies;
- Public health-related practices and effects of industries, including food and beverage, tobacco, and motor transport;
- Organization, financing and delivery of health services in market-economies;
- Medicalization of health and its effects on public health;
- Market forces and migration of health labour;
- Free market economies and democracy, social capital, and freedom.

SUBMISSION

All IJPH author’s guidelines and double-blind peer-review rules apply (see IJPH website). The editors **will invite articles** based on abstracts. The abstracts should contain:

- The working title of the article;
- Key authors and institutions;
- A sentence that explains your article’s connection to the call theme and the Global South;
- A brief description of background, methods, main findings and their implications; if you have not yet finished your analysis, you may discuss the potential significance of your work instead of presenting your main findings (maximum 300 words).

If you want to send us an abstract, please direct it to the IJPH managing editor (anke.berger@swisstph.ch), with the subject line “IJPH Call Market&PH”. Please note that an invitation to submit a full article is no guarantee for acceptance after peer review.

AWARD RULES

IJPH will award the best among all accepted articles. The AWARD includes USD 500 and ‘permanent free online access’ of the article under SpringerNature license. Please note that the award does not include a waiver for open access publication in IJPH.

IJPH will invite the registered participations of the conference, all reviewers of the call and the IJPH editors to anonymously vote online the best article (based on the final abstract). Editors will pre-select 3-4 accepted articles for the online voting.

The first authors of the winning article will be presented during the conference in Cali by the editors of the call. The money will be handed over directly at the conference (no bank transfer!) to the award winner or a colleague designated to the IJPH editorial office.

DEADLINES

We will not consider requests for extension of deadlines.

31 October 2019: Submission of the abstract to anke.berger@swisstph.ch. The managing editor will notify by 07 November 2019 if or if not the proposed article is invited for submission.

31 January 2020: Online submission of invited articles. Manuscripts must fully comply with IJPH instructions for article type, length and format, and must contain an Ethical Statement (please consult the IJPH instructions for authors), otherwise they will not be considered for the call.

15 June 2020: Online submission of the finally revised version for the award competition.
 29 July 2020: Online first publication of successful revisions submitted by 15 June 2020.

We recommend sending in invited submissions and revised versions well before deadlines. Depending on reviewer and editor comments, several revisions may be required before we accept or reject a manuscript. The final version must reflect all requests for revision. Finally revised articles are eligible to participate in the AWARD competition only when received by 15 June 2020. Final revisions received after 15 June until 20 July 2020 will still be considered for the special issue but will not participate in the award competition nor can we guarantee online first publication date (if accepted) by the beginning of the conference.
